

How to plug in the optical module



Overview

To use an SFP optical module, first confirm that the host port is SFP-type. Figure 1 SFP Optical Module. Small Form-factor Pluggable modules (SFP module) are the workhorses of modern network connectivity, enabling flexible fiber optic or copper links between switches, routers, firewalls, and servers. They enable high-speed connections between active equipment and allow system scalability without the need for full infrastructure replacement. Optical cables transmit audio signals using light pulses, so both the transmitting and receiving devices must have optical cable ports.

How to plug in the optical module



Align the module with the device's SFP port, ensuring TX/RX labels match the cable's direction. Gently push the module until it clicks into place (a latch will secure it).



Remove the dust plug from an optical port. Keep the dust plug for future use. Ensure that the optical module is correctly oriented and gently push it into the optical port until you hear a click. If the optical ...

To connect an optical cable to an SFP module, use the appropriate patch cord (e.g., LC-LC, SC-LC, etc.). The patch cord must match the fibre type – single-mode or multi-mode. Once ...
