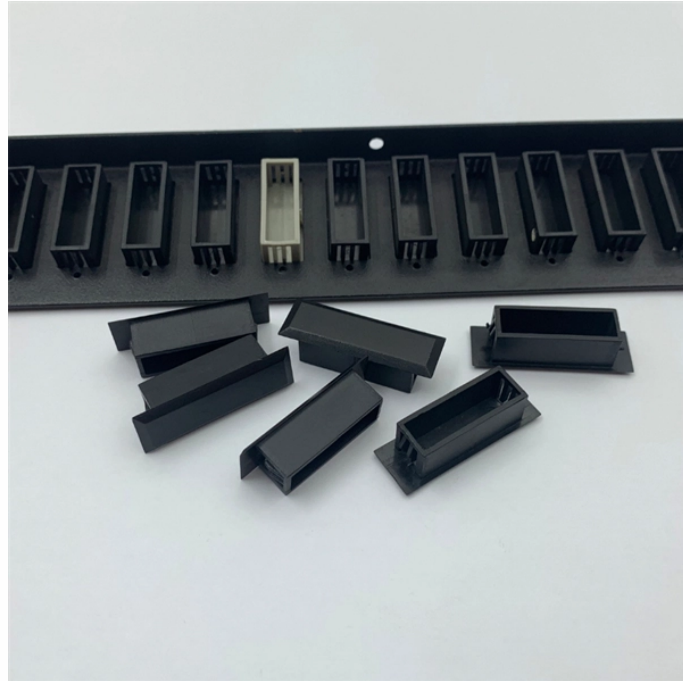

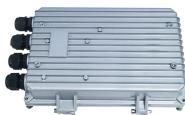
Since antiquity, the armor was used in the Indian subcontinent. This is the list of armor used by Indian soldiers at different periods in history.
